I. The Center for Excellence in Youth Education (CEYE)

The Center for Excellence in Youth Education (CEYE), a unit within the Mount Sinai Health System's Office for Diversity and Inclusion, has worked for over four decades to expose young minds from educationally and economically disadvantaged backgrounds to science and medicine through its robust education pipeline program portfolio. Established in 1975, CEYE serves close to 300 students in grades 7 through collegiate level each year. All courses focus on inquiry-based learning and career exploration.

Northeast Regional Alliance (NERA) MedPrep Program

This is a three-year medical school preparedness program for New York and New Jersey residents, which is administered through the Center for Excellence in Youth Education & the Center for Multicultural and Community Affairs at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. Eligible applicants are currently enrolled in any **college** as freshmen or sophomore and are interested in attending medical school. NERA MedPrep is a **3-year summer** commitment designed to give students an opportunity to develop key skills and competencies that are important to success on the road to medical school.

Medical Discovery of Careers (MEDDocs)

MedDocs is a medical student-run organization, which is part of the SEOM interest group (Students for Equal Opportunities in Medicine). The program is help three times a year and lasts 7-8 weeks with separate curricula: cardiovascular system, pulmonary system, and neuroscience. High school students will be taught by a group of medical students and will have the opportunity to participate in hands-on science enrichment activities.

MedDOCs also offers a summer internship program for MedDOCs alumni, called MedDOCs+. Students who have successfully completed the MedDOCs curricula are invited to volunteer at the Mount Sinai Hospital in various departments.

First Generation Scholars is a program for high school seniors who will be the first generation in their families to attend college or who come from underserved communities. First Generation Scholars is a college essay-mentoring program, which also provides scholarships to winners of our essay contest and to students who complete all program requirements. Participation is free of cost. Each week, students will meet for 1.5 hours with Mount Sinai students, who have extensive undergraduate writing experience. The high school students will work one-on-one with their mentors to produce high-quality college application essays. There will also be several activities throughout the year to foster the mentor-mentee relationship.
