Mount Sinai is thrilled to be participating in the ASCO-led pilot of an integrated Hematology/Oncology and Hospice & Palliative Medicine (HPM) Fellowship Program. We are in a unique position to harness the strengths of the Tisch Cancer Institute and the Department of Geriatrics and Palliative Medicine at Mount Sinai to provide the integrated fellow with a robust clinical experience and opportunity to develop scholarly work in areas that bring both fields together and train future academic leaders.

We have **1 position** for the integrated track each recruitment cycle.

The program will be a **3-year fellowship program with an optional 4th year dedicated to research**.

Year 1

- The first year will be focused on HPM training with outpatient oncology rotations with a continuity clinic in Supportive Oncology
- The fellow will attend HPM Academic Half Day and conferences (Thursday afternoons)
- Weeknight call by phone and weekends on call will be for HPM

Year 2 and 3

- Years 2 and 3 will be focused on Hematology/Oncology training (inpatient and outpatient)
- Continuity clinic in Hematology/Oncology
- The fellow will attend Hematology/Oncology Academic Half Day and conferences (Thursday afternoons)
- Weeknight call by phone and weekends on call will be for Hematology/Oncology

At the completion of year 3, the fellow will be eligible to sit for the Hematology, Medical Oncology and HPM ABIM board examinations.

The block schedule has been designed for maximal integration and lack of rotation duplication to streamline each fellow's training.

Research time will be divided between Years 1, 2 and 3

Goal to identify a mentor and research interest in an area that integrates Hematology/Oncology and HPM. The fellow's Research Advisory Committee (RAC) will include faculty from both Hematology/Oncology and HPM and will meet every 6 months to provide additional research guidance.

A **4th year** for protected mentored research time will be available as a non-ACGME accredited Research Fellowship.

Fellows can also elect to apply for a **GME funded scholarship** to pursue a Masters degree in the Icahn School of Medicine Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences (Master of Science in Clinical Research, Master of Public Health and others) in years 3 and 4 of fellowship training.
