2022 BFSCI/SBDRC/Dermatology Pilot Grant Program

Pilot grants from the Black Family Stem Cell Institute (BFSCI), the Skin Biology and Diseases Resource-based Center (SBDRC), and the Department of Dermatology at Mount Sinai are available to support research projects in skin stem cell biology, skin regeneration, and skin diseases.

- 1. **Research Grants (up to \$40K)** will be accepted from PI's meeting any of the following criteria:
 - New PI's (< 5 years from appointment as Assistant Professor) who have not had R01, P01 or equivalent funding
 - Established basic research or clinical investigators outside the field of skin stem cell biology, skin regeneration, and skin diseases who wish to apply their expertise to these areas
- 2. Transition to Independence Minigrants (up to \$10K)
 - Post-doctoral research fellows with at least 1 year of post-doctoral research training
 - Instructors with at least 1 year of research training
 - Dermatology residents engaged in research

Application due date: October 5, 2022

Anticipated funding start date: December 31, 2022

Funding duration: 1 year with the possibility of renewal for a second year

Applications should include the following elements:

- 1. Research Strategy (1 page): include Title, Name and Affiliations, Significance, Innovation, and Approach
- 2. Figures (1 page)
- 3. Bibliography and References Cited (1 page)
- 4. For transition to independence grants: Letter of Support from the postdoctoral mentor stating how the grant will support a unique line of research separate from PI of the laboratory (required)
- 5. Budget using the NIH Budget Page PHS398/FP5 and budget justification
- 6. NIH Biosketch
- 7. Other Support
- 8. Vertebrate Animals and Human Subjects information in NIH format (if applicable).
